

Multimedia Club Update

Classes are free with a club membership of \$20 per individual or \$30 per couple. If class registration does not fill up, the class is open to FOS residents at \$5 per session. **Register your membership and classes at an open lab on Mondays, Tuesdays or Wednesdays from 10AM to 12PM. Classes are held in the Multimedia Lab.**

The Photography Class with instructor Hank Nelson is on Tuesdays, from January 06 through March 31 from 10AM to 12PM. Whether you own a smartphone, a digital camera, or a simple point-and-shoot, this class welcomes all photography enthusiasts. No special equipment is required, just bring the camera you have and a willingness to learn.

You'll learn:

- 1) how to take a good photo: lighting, angles, and composition,
- 2) editing techniques to enhance your images and
- 3) staging tips to make your photos stand out.

Field trips are included so students will have the chance to put their skills into practice, capturing real-world scenes and experimenting with different styles of photography. This is a fantastic opportunity for anyone interested in improving their photography skills, exploring creativity, and learning how to make everyday moments picture-perfect.

The iPhone/iPad Class with instructor Kathy Rath will be held on **Thursdays, January 8, 15, 22, and 29, from 1PM to 3PM.** Each week will focus on a different set of topics. The first session will focus on settings. Week two will work on texts and emails. Organize your Contacts, Calendars, and Control Center in the third session. The last class will explore how to organize your many photos, so they are easier to find. There will also be instruction about some of the fun things you can do with your photos. Participants will receive a printed guide at each session, and every class will

include time for Q&A, ensuring that attendees can get personalized help with their devices. **Class size is limited to 24 people, so early registration is encouraged.** This program is perfect for anyone who wants to feel more comfortable with their Apple devices, whether you're a beginner or simply looking to explore new features.

We'll cover tools like Copilot, AI-powered photo editing, smart search, accessibility enhancements, and real-world examples seniors find especially helpful.. No technical background required.



NEW YEAR – NEW LEAGUES STARTING!


If you didn't get to any of the fall Co-ed and Lightening games, even more FOS teams and players will be gearing up for January and February!

Meet the Players: Allen Ostrowski

Allen grew up on a farm in Galloway, a predominantly Polish rural town in central Wisconsin. He and his four siblings helped work the largest dairy farm in the area with 32 cows! This hard work translated into strong athleticism. Allen describes his older brother, Eddie, as a "tremendous ballplayer." His sister's two daughters won the first state championship in softball. Allen's son, Christopher, pitched for his high school's state championship baseball game. He also played on the young (15-16 yr olds) Minnesota Golden Gophers team that won the world championship in Guam!



Allen started playing ball at a young age. In high school he excelled in football, wrestling, and running track – qualifying for state high hurdles where he placed 8th! After graduating he returned to softball, playing 4 to 5 days a week with adult "beer leagues."

Allen married his high school sweetheart, DeAnna, a year after graduation. They just celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary! The couple moved to Milwaukee and worked for Briggs & Stratton, the world's largest small engine producer. Not wanting to raise a family in the big city, they returned to Galloway where Allen started driving truck. He enjoyed this so much that he still does it to this day. Allen and DeAnna started spending winters in FOS in 2008, leaving behind another favorite pastime...snowmobiling. After enjoying 40 years of riding the snowy trails and one harrowing incident of going through the ice with his brother Patrick, Allen was ready to take up softball again. Allen has spent quite a bit of time playing for and managing various teams for FOS because "Out on the diamond is where all the magic happens!"
